Dear Residents

How time flies since my appointment as Chairman of the council earlier this year, and what an eventful year it has been so far, with both good and unfortunately bad things happening in the village. So far we have seen the closure of Read Library, and the cancellation of some bus routes through the village this year. As a parish council we have tried our best to prevent these happening, and have made our views clear to the appropriate authorities, but to no avail.

So on a positive note what has the Council done so far this year? Here are some of the highlights for me so far: -

- Resurfacing of the church footpath from Straits Lane to St John's Gate
- A new parish council notice board at the end of the church path on Straits Lane
- Installation of a new Picnic bench on the playground
- Offering an opinion on planning matters to be considered by the planning authority.

There really are too many other activities to mention; they all require a great deal of background work that is traditionally shared between the clerk, council members and volunteers. As I mentioned in my last report, good council work is truly a fully inclusive community effort.

On that note I would also like to thank Bill Harrison for his time as a Parish Councillor, unfortunately Bill has needed to resign from the parish council, and his support will be sadly missed by us all. I am however, happy to welcome Jodie Crosland as a new Parish Councillor, I am sure that she will enjoy her time on the council, and will make a valuable contribution to the life of the village.
